



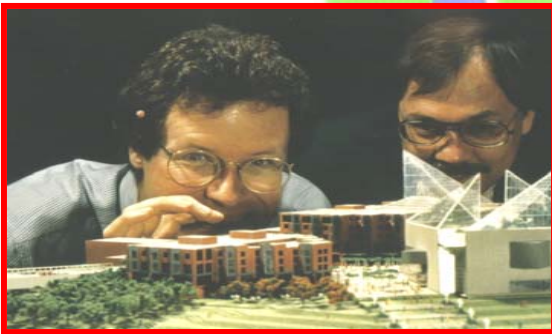
# tennessee Riverpark

## A Brief 25-Year History:

- **1982** – The Moccasin Bend Task Force is formed.
- **1985** – The Tennessee Riverpark Master Plan is completed.



- **1987** – Construction begins for the Riverpark's first 55-acre segment.
- **1989** – The first phase, "Fishing Park" opens near the C. B. Robinson Bridge.
- **1991** – TVA extends the Riverpark upstream to the Chickamauga Dam.
- **1992** – Ross's Landing Plaza and the Tennessee Aquarium open.



- **1993 & 1994** – Additional Riverwalk segments are added upstream from Ross's Landing including the "switchbacks" and the Martin Amphitheatre.

- **1995** – The Walnut Street Bridge returns to life as a new pedestrian link to the North Shore.
- **1996** – The new Lookout Rowing Center is completed.
- **1997 & 1998** – New segments connect the Hunter and Bluff View to the Rowing Center through Battery Place, Manker Patten and UTC.
- **1999** – Coolidge Park and the North Shore Riverwalk add 8 acres of popular urban park.
- **2002** – Intense planning for the 21st Century Waterfront begins.
- **2005** – The Millennium Riverpark Project opens a 5-mile link connecting the original "Fishing Park" site downstream through the Amnicola Marsh and over South Chickamauga Creek to the Rowing Center area. The 21st Century Waterfront opens.



- **2006** – Renaissance Park adds 23 acres of constructed wetlands and walkways on the North Shore.
- **2007** – Nine new Jim Collins Riverwalk Mile Marker sculptures extend from the Dam to the Chattanooga Pier.
